The Boathouse on the Lake

Once situated on the lake near the Marton Crossroads entrance to the park, this boathouse is long gone and the lake itself has been re-landscaped in recent times.

The Secret Lakes




Behind this bench is a path sweeping round to the left. Follow it to the junction and then take the path to the right. Follow it until you come to the lakes. There will be a bench to your right. Look for another card attached to it.

To the colonnade

Walk across the bridge and turn left onto the grey path leading past the second bridge, continue till you see the side of the museum. To the left are steps up to the colonnade. To avoid steps, just take the little path to the left. Look for the next card on a park bench down on the grassy area.

The Colonnade



On your right, you will see a row of evenly spaced arches supported by a series of symmetrically spaced columns this is the Colonnade which was used by the residents of the Hall as a covered walkway in inclement weather. The parkland and Marton Hall were sold to Middlesbrough in 1923 by Henry Bolckow's son. The man behind the purchase was Councillor Thomas Desmond Brown who
